

July 23, 1881.

The Executive Committee met in the office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction, Insubert:

The Secretary reported that certain repairs were necessary to be made on the building during the present vacation, and that the Legislature had provided an appropriation in the Supply Bill of \$1500 for such repairs.

Whereupon Mr. Waterbury and Mr. Murray were appointed a committee on repairs with authority to determine what repairs should be made and to make arrangements for having them made during the ^{+ not to exceed \$600.-} summer vacation.

The Treasurer reported that before the end of the fiscal year September 30th 1881, the liabilities of the normal school would exceed its resources by nearly eight hundred dollars; and that according to an estimate he had made for the

coming fiscal year there would be a further deficiency of about two hundred and fifty dollars; making by the end of the year September 30th 1882 a total deficiency of nearly \$1050. A discussion followed in regard to the measures to be adopted in order to meet this deficiency, but without taking action thereon, the business was postponed to the next meeting.

Proposals for furnishing coal for the use of the school for the ensuing season were received as follows:

By Charles M. Stuart for 100 gross tons of Lehigh Egg coal, and 20 tons of Lehigh nut coal	\$635

Whereupon it was resolved that a contract be made with Charles M. Stuart for the supply of coal above stated.
