Resolved That Darwin Eaton be appointed Librarian for the current term at a salary of one dollar per week.

The Principal having made arrangements to open the Experimental School the Committee took up the subject of applicants for admission: whereupon it was Resolved.

That all other things being equal, the order of time should decide the question of any application; but that cases of orphanage, of destitution, or of special arrangement on the part of any member of this Committee shall be entitled to a favorable consideration.
