

## Data Dissemination Plan

We value ensuring that the results of our research are accessible to those who participated, as well as the general public, mental health providers, and other researchers. As a result, we have a multipronged plan for disseminating the results following data analysis.

- We will submit articles that describe the results of our study and implications of those results to peer-reviewed psychology journals for publication.
- A brief summary of the key findings from the study will be disseminated via email/mail to any participants who indicated that they were interested in the results, organizations we contacted to distribute our survey, and powwow organizers we connected with when recruiting.
- We will also submit a brief summary of findings for publication in the *Journal of Indigenous Research*.
- We will submit abstracts to present findings at national conferences such as the National Multicultural Conference and Summit, American Psychological Association and Winter Roundtable.
- Data will be stored on a secure server, Xythos, with access limited to current members of the research team. The data will be stored separately from any names and email addresses that we collect for compensation or follow-up purposes.
- Generally, data will not be shared with anyone outside of the research team. Special permission from **both** of the Principal Investigators must be secured before any other researcher is given access to data. In such circumstances, the requestors would be required to sign an agreement indicating that they will maintain the privacy and security of the data and that they will not share the data with others. Requestors receiving approval would only be given access to completely de-identified data related to the specific variables of interest.
