authorized to procure such additional  
assistant as he should deem necessary.

The Secretary further stated that the  
efforts of the Committee to whom was com-  
mitted the matter of finding a Principal  
had not been successful. Since the meeting  
of Feb. 1<sup>st</sup> they had corresponded with the  
Rev. Dr. King, Principal of the Fort Edward  
Collegiate Institute, and with Mr. A. P.  
Stone of Portland, Maine, but that the  
present exigencies of both were such as  
to prevent their accepting the appoint-  
ment.

The name of the Rev. Joseph Alden D.D. LL.D.  
had been mentioned in the most favorab-  
le terms, and after some conversation in  
regard to him, the Secretary was directed  
to invite Dr. Alden to an interview with  
the Committee for mutual consultation  
in regard to an appointment as Principal.

The Committee then adjourned.

The Committee met at the call of  
the Chairman,

Present the Chairman,

Mr. Powersend,

Mr. Woolworth.

The minutes of the last meeting were read  
and approved.

The Secretary stated that in conformity  
with the power given to him as acting Prin-  
cipal at the meetings of March 5<sup>th</sup> April  
1<sup>st</sup>. and that he had employed Miss

Rebecca Dant a graduate of the last  
term as a assistant in the Primary depart-  
ment, and Miss Rebecca Dant a graduat  
e of the 27<sup>th</sup> term as a assistant in the Exper-  
imental Department.

The agreement with Miss Ward was that she should be paid at the rate of Four hundred & fifty dollars a year. The compensation of Miss Osterhout was to be such as should, in the judgment of the Principal, be proper for the services rendered.

On the 22<sup>d</sup> of April Miss. Maulette principal assistant in the Experimental Department, presented her resignation to a captain appointment as Principal of one of the Public Schools in the city of Syracuse. Miss Ward was placed in the position vacated by the resignation of Miss Maulette, and Miss. Ellen L. Kuyss was employed in place of Miss Ward. Miss. Kuyss was a graduate of the last term.

It was on motion of Mr. Powers and resolved that the above appointments meet the approval of the Committee and accordingly confirmed.

The following entry was ordered to be made on the minutes of the present meeting.

In conformity with the direction to the Secretary at the last meeting the Rev. Dr. Alden was invited to an interview with the Committee on the 8<sup>d</sup> of April last. The several members of the committee, with the exception of Mr. Powers who was absent from the city saw & conversed with Dr. Alden. He visited the school, was introduced to the members of the faculty and every opportunity was given him for learning the organization and arrangements of the school. It was found quite inconvenient to have a formal meeting of the Committee, but all the members who were in the city expressed their hearty concurrence in the appointment of Dr Alden and by direction of the chairman the appointment was tendered to the Secretary, and was accepted.

and Dr. Alden entered on his duties as Principal on the 22<sup>nd</sup>. of April. Whereupon the following resolution was unanimously adopted. Resolved that the informal appointment of the Rev Joseph Alden D.D. L.L.D. also referred to is hereby confirmed, and that his salary shall be twenty one hundred dollars with the dwelling house provided in the school building for the Principal and necessary fuel and gas.

Dr Alden submitted a second course of study and organization of the several departments of the school, which having been read and discussed was adopted and ordered to be printed under the direction of the chairman in such form as he shall deem proper.

Dr Alden also submitted a paper in regard to the desirable sum of better provision for the boarding of the female pupils, which was laid on the table for future consideration.

It was ordered that the title of Principal of the Normal School be changed to that of President.

The committee then adjourned.
