
Robert Morris 69, Albany 57



BILLY VAN JURA NAMED TO ECAC DIVISION I-AA ALL-STAR TEAM




WOMEN Buffalo 71, Albany 57



Grever, a senior linebacker, led the Great Danes with 88 tackles, including seven for losses and 1.5 sacks, and added three interceptions, five pass break-ups and two blocked kicks. He finished his career as the school's all-time tackles leader with 351, and had 24 career games with double-figure tackles.

Joining Grever on the first team were split end **Chris Phillis** (Saratoga Springs H.S.), tight end **Steve Checksfield**, right tackle **Jason Barra** and free safety **Samson Brown**.

Phillis, who was also an All-NEC second-team return specialist, caught 33 passes for 635 yards and six touchdowns, and led the Great Danes in all-purpose yards with 902 in his first season as a regular. Brown, a redshirt freshman, had 62 tackles and six pass break-ups. Barra was a three-year starter for a offensive unit that was among the nation's leaders in scoring (37.0 ppg) and total offense (424.1 yards/game). Checksfield, a junior, had 14 receptions for 299 yards and four touchdowns.

Albany Football 2-2-2-2

Senior tailback **Greg Garrett** and five other Great Danes were named to the All-NEC second team. Garrett rushed for 725 yards and eight touchdowns, and also caught three scoring passes. He completed his career as Albany's all-time leader in rushing (2,958), all-purpose yards (3,562), scoring (204 points) and touchdowns (33). Also picked by the conference's coaches to the second-team unit were cornerback Jelani Dandles (Bishop Maginn H.S.), left tackle J.T. Herfurth, left guard Billy Van Jura, outside linebacker Robert Anderson, and defensive tackle Chris Wilgosz.

Albany finished its first season at the NCAA Division I-AA level with a 7-2 record, and placed second in the conference with a 6-1 mark.
