

the supervision of the Architect.

The committee then adjourned to meet on the care of the chairman for further consultation on the condition of the building.

February 26th, 1883

The Executive Committee of the Normal School met at 71 Hawk St. at 8:30 P.M. Present: Dr. Mosher, Mr. Murray and Mr. Draper. Dr. Mosher presided.

President Waterbury was present by invitation. The subject of the repairs required for the building and the wants of the school were discussed. On motion, Mr. Draper in behalf of the Committee was authorized to lay before the Committee on Ways and Means the wants of the school and ask first for \$2,000 for repairs ^{or} and \$3,500 for a reference library; also ask for the appointment of a special committee to examine the

building in order to determine what steps should be taken for rendering it satisfactory. The Committee then adjourned.

The Executive Committee met in the office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction.

Mr. Waterbury, president of the Normal School was present by invitation.

Dr. Mosher stated the object of the meeting: That the Senate on the recommendation of the Finance Committee had passed a bill appropriating \$125,000 for a new building for a Normal School; that this bill was now pending in the Committee of Ways and Means of the Assembly; and
