ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION
AND THE REGENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY, ON THE
NEW YORK STATE NORMAL SCHOOL.

To the Legislature :

Pursuant to the provisions of the act, chapter 318, of the Laws of 1848, the undersigned herewith transmit their annual report, containing a full account of their proceedings, and of the expenditures of money for the support of said school, together with a detailed statement of the progress, condition, and prospects thereof, as shown by the accompanying report of the Executive Committee.

REPORT.

To the Superintendent of Public Instruction and the Regents of the University :

The Executive Committee of the New York State Normal School respectfully report :

During the year embracing the forty-seventh and forty-eighth terms, two hundred and ninety students were admitted to the New York State Normal School. Their average age was eighteen years. The average time spent in teaching before entering the institution was a little more than one year. The whole number of pupils during the year was three hundred and seventy-five, representing all the counties in the State with the exception of eight. At the close of the forty-seventh term, twenty-two young ladies and five young gentlemen, and at the close of the forty-eighth term, twenty-six young ladies and fifteen young gentlemen, received their diplomas as graduates of the institution.

The changes in the course of instruction and training, mentioned in the last report, have had a marked influence in promoting the efficiency of the school. None of these changes was more important than that requiring the candidates for a diploma to teach ten consecutive weeks in the model and primary schools. The capacity of each pupil for teaching is thus thoroughly tested, hence the possession of a diploma is evidence not only of good scholarship, but of ability to teach.

During the year increased attention was paid to the English language and the noble literature it embodies.

At the commencement of the forty-eighth term Miss Amelia E. Daley was appointed teacher of rhetoric. In consequence of this appointment, increased and more efficient attention has been given to English composition.

At the middle of the forty-eighth term, Miss Rebecca Jones resigned her post as principal of the primary school, and was succeeded by her assistant, Miss Ella L. Keyes. The flourishing condition of the school under Miss Keyes' administration has proved the wisdom of her appointment. Subsequently, Miss Elizabeth J. Gibson was appointed assistant teacher in the primary school.

Before the opening of the present term, Prof. F. S. Jewell resigned the professorship of the English language and literature, to take charge of the Delaware Literary Institute at Franklin, N. Y. Prof. Jewell had served the institution with great zeal and ability for many years, and carried with him to his new field of labor the best wishes of the committee, and of his associates in the work of instruction.

The Model School is in a flourishing condition. While it furnishes good instruction to its pupils, it is invaluable as a school of practice for the graduating class in the Normal School. The views of the superintendent of this school are in perfect harmony with those of the head of the Normal School, and their united efforts are attended with gratifying success.

It is with deep regret that the committee have to report the death of Professor Amos Dean, who was appointed a member of the Executive committee in the place of the late Hon. Charles L. Austin. In the death of Mr. Dean, who had long been identified with the interests of education, the community at large sustained a great loss.

DESIGN OF THE NORMAL SCHOOL.

The design of the Institution is to furnish well qualified teachers for the Public Schools of the State of New York. Students receive a thorough drilling in all the branches which they will be called to teach, and in such other studies as experience has shown to be best adapted to discipline and develop the mind. Those who train the minds of others, should themselves have well trained minds.

Besides receiving from the Faculty instruction in the art of teaching, the pupils are, at the proper stage of their progress, required to teach in the Model and Primary Schools, for a term of ten weeks, under the supervision and criticism of the President and other teachers.

The course of instruction and practice occupies two years. The year is divided into two terms of twenty weeks each. The students are divided into two classes, Junior and Senior.

All candidates for admission to the school must furnish satisfactory evidence of good moral character.

Candidates for admission to the Junior class must, if ladies, be not less than sixteen years of age, and if gentlemen, not less than eighteen. They must pass a satisfactory examination in Spelling, Reading, Writing, Geography, Arithmetic and English Grammar, and must subscribe a declaration that their object in connecting themselves with the school, is to prepare themselves for the work of instruction in the Public Schools of the State.

Those who may not be found qualified to enter the Junior class, may be admitted to a Preparatory class, in which the studies necessary for admission to the Junior class are pursued.

Those who desire to enter on an advanced standing, must, in addition to the examination for the Junior class, pass a satisfactory

examination in all the studies which have been pursued by the class to which they seek admission.

COURSE OF STUDY.

JUNIOR CLASS—FIRST TERM.

Arithmetic, Algebra, English Grammar, Physiology, Geography, Ancient and Modern History.

JUNIOR CLASS—SECOND TERM.

Higher Arithmetic, Natural Philosophy, Ethics, Science of Government, History of the United States, Botany, Geometry.

SENIOR CLASS—FIRST TERM.

Geometry continued, Natural Philosophy continued, Astronomy, Political Economy, Higher Algebra, Rhetoric, English Literature.

SENIOR CLASS—SECOND TERM.

English Literature continued, Intellectual and Moral Philosophy, Trigonometry and Surveying, Chemistry, Geology, Evidences of Christianity, Butler's Analogy, Washington's Farewell Address.

Composition, Extempore Speaking, Elocution, Vocal Music, Drawing and Penmanship, receive prominent attention throughout the course.

To those who complete the above course, and perform the required amount of teaching in the model and primary schools, the following diploma will be given :

POST GRADUATE CLASS.

Graduates of the School who may desire still higher qualifications, may receive instruction in the Latin and French languages, and in

[By an act of the Legislature, passed April 11, 1849, "every teacher shall be deemed a qualified teacher who shall have in possession a Diploma from the State Normal School."]

the higher mathematical and philosophical studies. Members of this class will also be permitted to review any of their previous studies in connection with the under graduate classes.

TUITION AND TEXT BOOKS.

Tuition and text books are furnished free of charge. *The amount of fare necessarily paid in coming by public conveyance to the School* will be refunded to those who are present at the beginning of the term and remain till its close.

The price of board in respectable families varies from \$4.50 to \$5 per week, exclusive of washing. Those who wish to board themselves, can procure furnished rooms at \$1 per week. By so doing, they can reduce their expenses for board to \$3 per week.

The next term opens on the last Wednesday of February. Students should reach Albany the day before the opening of the term. They should come at once to the Normal School Building, whence they will be directed to boarding houses approved by the faculty. They should retain their checks until they procure rooms, when their baggage will be delivered free of charge.

PERSONS ENTITLED TO ADMISSION.

Each county is entitled to twice as many pupils as it has representatives in the Assembly. Students are appointed by the Superintendent of Public Instruction on recommendation of the School Commissioners, subject to the required examination. When the quota of a county is filled, candidates having the proper qualifications will be appointed to fill vacancies in the representation of other counties, on application to the President. As such vacancies have always existed, the School is practically open to all who desire to fit themselves to become teachers.

APPARATUS.

The apparatus of the school is well selected, and sufficiently extensive to illustrate all the important principles in natural philosophy, surveying, chemistry and human physiology. Extraordinary facilities for the study of natural history are afforded by the museum of the Medical College and the State collections, which are open at all hours for visitors.

LIBRARY.

Besides an abundant supply of text-books upon all the branches of the course of study, a well selected miscellaneous library has been procured, to which all the pupils may have access, free of charge. In the selection of this library, particular care has been exercised to procure most of the recent works upon education, as well as valuable standard works upon the natural sciences, history, mathematics, &c. The State Library is also freely accessible to all.

TERMS AND VACATIONS.

The *Fall Term* will begin on the third Wednesday in September, and continue twenty weeks.

The *Spring Term* will begin on the last Wednesday in February.

QUALIFICATIONS OF CANDIDATES FOR APPOINTMENT.

The following extracts from a circular issued to the School Commissioners, by the State Superintendent of Public Instruction, clearly present the qualifications which are deemed essential :

“The School Commissioners are directed to give the most extended notice in their power, of vacancies, and to interest themselves in finding proper pupils to be appointed.

“In making the selections, those who, from past successful experience, have proved their aptness to teach, or from traits of character, clearly developed, give fair promise of future success, should be preferred. Talents not below mediocrity, unblemished morals and sound health, are regarded as indispensable. In your visitations of the schools, you will sometimes find teachers who only need the instruction which this school is designed to give, to insure their highest

success and usefulness; or pupils who have given proof of good scholarship, which by being properly directed, may be made of great value in the cause of education. Such teachers and scholars you will encourage to seek these appointments."

"For the want of qualified applicants, the quotas of some counties may not be filled, while the number of worthy and qualified applicants in other counties may be greater than the quota to which such counties are *strictly* entitled. Therefore, you need not limit your recommendations to the number to which your county is entitled by representation in the Assembly, but encourage aspiring, qualified, promising young men and women who intend to make teaching their vocation, to attend this school."

"Allow me to urge you to use all proper means to extend information in regard to this school, and to induce young persons who possess the requisite qualifications, to participate in its benefits."

"It is suggested that you advertise to receive applications and to examine applicants for appointment at a specified place."

THE MODEL AND PRIMARY SCHOOLS.

These schools are designed to furnish models of organization, government and instruction, and to afford ample opportunities for observation and practice on the part of the pupils of the Normal School.
