The Committee met in the office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction, present Mr. Skinner in the chair, and Messrs. Pruyne, Van Rensselaer and the Secy. and Dr. Milne, by invitation.

The sub-committee, appointed at the last meeting to ascertain the value of real estate adjoining the College buildings, made an informal report. In substance it was reported that the Bender property in the rear of the College, comprising nos. 285 to 297 Lark St., both inclusive, with the lots in the rear of those named, could be bought for \$50,000. - The Zobin property, nos. 455 to 463 Madison Ave., both inclusive, could be had for \$18,000. Nos. 467 & 469 Madison Ave. & 104 Willett St., all belonging to Ellen Minck, for \$13,000. No. 465 Madison Ave. for \$8,000. No. 102 Willett St. for \$8,500. No. 100 Willett for \$15,000. And no. 98 Willett, next door to the College, for \$9,000.

The Superintendent stated that the attitude of the Wags and Means Com. was such that it was useless to endeavor to secure any large appropriation, and it was agreed that Mr. Skinner and Dr. Milne should try to get only enough to purchase no. 98 Willett St. and make necessary changes in the present building to secure safe exit in case of fire.

On motion the meeting adjourned.
