strike. Every union man and woman has a stake in the outcome. Industry must be put on notice that the old tactics of starving workers into submission will not work. No matter how long this strike may last, we must make it clear that we will not permit any steelworker to suffer hunger or undue privation.

This is a strike against <u>Foulwarism</u> which holds as a primary principal the philosophy that high wages are bad and that adequate living standards are not for the likes of working people.

It is a strike to halt the return of speedup to the plants, something that the steel industry is attempting to restore under the guise of ending alleged featherbedding.

The steel industry has embraced Boulwarism and all that it stands for: shotgun negotiations by the industry and a take it or leave it approach to negotiations. Steel is the testing place, we in IUE could very well be next.

We doubt, sincerely, that IUE would have been successful in our long strike against Westinghouse if it were not for the generous contribution made by the USN-AFI.-CIO to the IUE strikers and its display of solidarity, certainly, helped maintain the morale of the W strikers at a high level.

It is requested that all IUE locals, immediately, set up committees to collect voluntary contributions from every union member in the shop: the sum of, one hour's pay per month for the duration of the steel strike. Should the President of the United States play a strike-breaking role, by invoking the Taft-Hartley injunction provisions, the dispute would be considered as still in existence and the contributions would continue during that period.

It is also, of vital importance that we visit the struck steel plants and walk the picket lines with our brother and sister Steelworkers and display to the steel companies, Industry in general, and the community IUE's support of the Steelworkers.

Not every case settled satisfactorily The Steelworkers' strike is everybody's has to go to the second level. This was especially so in a docket recently filed in behalf of Bro. A. Asch, a charter member of our Union with some 36 years of service.

> This docket requested an increase for Bro. Asch due to the fact that he was doing duties beyond his classification of Specialist on Varnish and Compound. At the first step, the Company gave usual unsatisfactory answer, At this point the usual procedure is to set up a second step meeting. Before this could be done by the Union Hall, Board Member Wager called the assistant business agent and requested more time to talk this case at the first step because he felt the grievance could be resolved there.

A few days later Mr. Wager called and informed the assistant business agent that he had settled the case satisfactorily by negotiating a one step increase from R-20 to R-21. This amounts to \$220,00 more per year for Mr. Asch excluding overtime which we understand is substantially high on this job.

CONGRESSIAN SAIDEL S. STRATTON accepted an invitation by our Officers and Executive Board and appeared before the membership at our October meeting.

Stratton stated further that he "was opposed to any | punitive measures taken against legitimate labor organizations".

In a show of solidarity, the Membership of Local 301 voted overwhelmingly by a 13 to 1 margin to support the Officers: and Executive Board request for an increase in the monthly dues.

In a secret closed-ballot vote, the members upheld the provisions of their Constitution which calls for an automatic Representative Stratton mentioned the increase in their dues whenever they receive an automatic increase in pay. The increase in dues amounts to 14¢ per month increasing the monthly dues from \$4.00 to \$4.14 per month. The new schedule is retroactive to October 1, 1959. This amounts to only one-half-cent a day or \$1.68 John Shambo, in introducing our guest per year.
