## UNIVERSITY AT ALBANY NAMES DR. GAIL CUMMINGS-DANSON INTERIM DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS AND RECREATION



## JOHNSTON SETS SCHOOL RECORD IN HEPTATHLON AT ECAC CHAMPIONSHIPS

Fairfax, Va. -- University at Albany's Janna Johnston (Shenendehowa H.S.) established two school records en route to a third-place finish in the women's heptathlon at the 16<sup>th</sup> ECAC Division I outdoor track & field championships on Saturday at George Mason University.

Johnston shattered her own Albany standard with 5,008 points in the seven-event competition, and set the previous mark (4,956) at this same meet one year ago. On the heptathlon's second day, she also eclipsed a record in the javelin with a throw of 113-07. The senior ran 2:23.74 in the 800-meter run, and went 17-08 in the long jump. Xiomara Davila Diaz was third in her 100-meter hurdles heat with a season-best time of 13.90 seconds, while the women's 400-meter relay ran 47.69 seconds to take sixth in its section.

The men's 123<sup>rd</sup> IC4A Division I championships are being held at the same facility. Albany's 3,200-meter relay was timed in a school-record 7:37.75 to place fourth in its heat. Ben Wright (Averill Park) and Rob Naughter (Guilderland) each posted sub-1:54 legs, while Eon Griffith and Steve Alicea were the other relay members.

## ALBANY ADVANCES IN ECAC DIVISION II BASEBALL CHAMPIONSHIP

Albany, N.Y. -- Third baseman Mike Kuebler had three hits, scored three times and drove in three runs, as Albany rallied for a 12-9 victory over Dowling in the opening round of the ECAC Division II Baseball Championship on Friday at Varsity Field.

Stony Brook, the top seed, defeated Southern Connecticut State, 8-2, earlier in the day, and will meet the Great Danes in the winner's bracket on Saturday at 10:00 a.m. in this double-elimination tournament.

Catcher Craig Ansman homered twice and drove in four runs to lead Stony Brook (34-11) to an easy win against Southern Connecticut State. Freshman pitcher Christopher Flinn improved to 8-1 on the season by scattering five hits and recording 13 strikeouts in a complete-game effort.

In the loser's bracket, Shawn Upton singled in the winning run with two outs in the ninth inning to lift Southern Connecticut State (25-19) to an 8-7 come-from-behind victory over Dowling. The Golden Lions finish their season at 23-18-1.

ALBANY, N.Y. -- The University at Albany's **Ben Wright**, **Kelly Paolino** and **Janna Johnston** have been chosen to receive Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) Merit Medals as Interim Director of Athletics Bob Ford announced today. The awards are annually given to the school's top senior male and female student-athletes who have shown excellence in the classroom and as competitive athletes during the current academic year.


Wright, of Averill Park (N.Y.) High School, is a three-time New England Collegiate Conference indoor mile champion, and the 1997 NECC cross country individual title winner. He has a 3.79 cumulative grade point average in business administration with an emphasis in finance. Wright will earn his undergraduate degree in a three-year period later this month, and has already accepted a position with Andersen Consulting.

Wright was voted to the 1998 GTE District I Academic All-America team, and is a Presidential Scholar and Dean's List student. He led the Great Danes to their second straight NECC cross country championship and an ECAC title last fall. Wright also competed the college indoor mile at the 1999 Millrose Games, and ran on the 3,200-meter and distance medley relays at Penn Relays.

Johnston, a standout track and field athlete, and Paolino, an all-conference guard in basketball, share the women's award. Johnston has a 3.49 GPA in mathematics with a dual minor in physics and computer science, while Paolino has a 3.58 in psychology with a minor in education.

Johnston, a Shenendehowa High School graduate, recently qualified for the ECAC championships in the heptathlon, and won the Albany Spring Classic with a meet-record 4,677 points. She set a school-mark (3,452) in the winning the ECAC indoor pentathlon, and captured her second consecutive NECC indoor high jump crown. Johnston, who owns eight Albany indoor and outdoor track records, won the UConn Invitational long jump by breaking the UA standard with a leap of 18-09.75. She led Albany to the 1999 NECC and ECAC indoor track championships. A Presidential Scholar, Johnston has interned with State Farm Insurance's public protection group.

Paolino, a graduate of Schalmont High School, made her second straight appearance on the All-NECC women's basketball team, and became the fourth player in school history to score 1,000 career points. A two-time captain, Paolino averaged 14.0 points, 3.6 assists, 3.7 rebounds and 3.0 steals in 1998-99. She finished her career ranked fourth in scoring (1,020), fourth in assists (332), second in steals (271) and first in games played (109) on Albany's all-time lists. Paolino, who has been accepted to Albany Law School, has served as chair of the school's student-athlete advisory committee, and worked as a volunteer at Veteran's Hospital.
